## **Liver Awareness Campaign sponsored by SHAC**

The <u>Somali Health Advisory Committee (SHAC)</u> received funding from Genentech to support a Liver Health Awareness Campaign. This one-year campaign will utilize a multi-tiered approach to promote liver health among East African Communities in Minnesota. The broad goals of this project are to increase liver health knowledge, reduce the burden of end-stage liver disease, and improve linkage to care for individuals with high liver risk. Using a community engagement framework, SHAC will implement a social marketing campaign by creating culturally relevant, linguistically appropriate, and timely messages. SHAC also will convene a network of diverse healthcare providers caring for African communities in Minnesota. SHAC will partner with other organizations and healthcare leaders to establish workshops offering CME & CEU credits for network members related to liver health disparities, early liver cancer detection, and improving liver health outcomes for African patients.

This project builds on previous funding from the <u>Saint Paul & Minneapolis Foundation's Pan African Community Endowment</u> (2020-2022) that supported SHAC to develop and pilot a social marketing campaign to promote hepatitis screening, follow-up care, and early cancer detection (prevention) educational programs that are culturally and linguistically acceptable. The outcome of this project are three Somali public service announcement videos that are now available for dissemination.

## **Updated Patient Registry**

The International Cholangiocarcinoma Patient Registry is a collaborative effort between patients and the global research community. Patients can participate in unique and urgent research efforts by allowing investigators access to their de-identified health records. You can join over 2,000 patients with cholangiocarcinoma (bile duct cancer) in this critical effort.

Stool sample collection added to GWAS (blood sample collection): Research teams at the Mayo Clinic are expanding their efforts to study the microbiome by adding stool sample collection for patients with cholangiocarcinoma. The data from this initiative will be shared widely with members of the research community.

The ability for patients to engage in and partner with researchers on efforts like these are critical to furthering scientific understanding of the mechanisms of this cancer.
