



Katherine Baicker, Ph.D.

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Dr. Baicker is the provost of the University of Chicago and the Emmett Dedmon Professor at the University of Chicago Harris School of Public Policy. She is a research associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research, and an elected member of the National Academy of Medicine, National Academy of Social Insurance, and American Academy of Arts & Sciences.

Prior to her appointment at the University of Chicago, Dr. Baicker was the C. Boyden Gray Professor of Health Economics in the Department of Health Policy and Management at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. Dr. Baicker also serves as a director of Eli Lilly and Company and as a trustee of the University of Chicago Medical Center, the Marine Biological Laboratory, Argonne National Laboratory, and NORC. She's a member of the Congressional Budget Office's Panel of Health Advisers and the Advisory Board for the National Institute for Health Care Management. She has also served as a Senate-confirmed member of the president's Council of Economic Advisers.

Dr. Baicker's research focuses on the effectiveness of public and private health insurance, including the effect of reforms on the distribution and quality of care. She is one of the leaders of the Oregon Health Insurance Experiment, a randomized study of the effects of Medicaid coverage.
