General Information

Course Description

The prevalence and consequences of concussion at all levels of ice hockey are concerning. Reduction of concussion risk, improved concussion diagnosis and management require a collaborative effort from medicine, psychology, sport science, coaching, engineering, officiating, manufacturing, and community partners. This quality scientific program will focus on education and will generate an evidence-based action plan designed to make a difference. All speakers are also being asked to discuss how gender differences influence the topic of their talk.

Course Learning Objectives

Overall Objectives:

- 1. To provide comprehensive, educational updates on concussions in ice hockey, including diagnosis, management, aftermath and prevention.
- 2. To identify a comprehensive, objective, and measureable 'action plan' to reduce the risks and consequences of concussion across levels of participation in ice hockey.

Learner Specific Objectives:

- 1. To identify scientific information on hockey related predictors, the pathophysiology and the sequelae of concussion.
- 2. To list strategies for head trauma prevention through medical and scientific education, behavioral modification (to reduce aggressive, harmful behavior), equipment alterations (i.e. improved helmet design), rule changes, conditioning and strengthening programs.
- To evaluate, after learning from sport scientists, engineers, and product manufacturers, the strengths and limitations of current hockey helmet design.

Core Group Outcome Objectives:

- To construct, write and then communicate (via professional publications and lay press) a strategic plan with a time line by which programs, rules, and standards can be evaluated and properly implemented.
- 2. To integrate the energy of health care professionals, if deemed appropriate, to propose improved standards for hockey helmets.

Physicians from sports medicine, emergency medicine, neurology, neurosurgery, radiology, pediatrics, and family practice, sport scientists, physical therapists, athletic trainers, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, coaches, ice hockey organization representatives, arena managers, manufacturers and researchers.
