

Patient Care




This study, published in a 2022 issue of Fertility and Sterility, compares three routes of myomectomy.

Patients undergoing laparoscopic, hysteroscopic or abdominal myomectomy routes demonstrate similar fertility

Investigators found that patients treated with any of three myomectomy routes had similar fertility postsurgically, allowing surgeons and their patients to select any route appropriate for the procedure.

Hysterectomy for endometrial cancer trending toward outpatient

Hysterectomy for endometrial cancer has shifted from the inpatient setting to minimally invasive surgery in the outpatient setting, according to a study published in International Journal of Gynecological Cancer.


